TOPIC 1: EDUCATION

1. Question: Some people think that children should begin their education at a very early age. Some think they should begin at least 7 years old.

Discuss both views and give your own opinion.

2. Question: Some people think that sending criminals to prison is not effective. Education and job training should be used instead.

Do you agree or disagree?

3. Question: Students should be taught academic knowledge so that they can pass exams, and skills such as cooking or dressing should not be taught.

To what extent do you agree/disagree?

4. Question: Some people think movies should only be for entertainment. Others think that they should also have educational values.

Discuss both views and give your opinion.

5. Question: The best way to ensure the growth of children is to make parents take parenting courses.

Do you agree or disagree?

6. Question: For centuries, important parts of education have remained such as reading, writing and Math. With the advent of computers, some people think that computer skills will be made fourth on the list.

To what extent do you agree?

TOPIC 2: WORK

1. Question: Many employers find that their new employees lack sufficient interpersonal skills such as lack of ability to work with colleagues as a team.

What are the causes? Can you suggest some possible solutions?

What will be the consequences of this? What solution can you offer?

6. Question: Many people find it hard to balance their work with other parts of their lives.

What are the reasons for this? How can this problem be overcome?

TOPIC 3: HEALTH

1. Question: It is more important to spend public money on promoting a healthy lifestyle in order to prevent illness than to spend it on treatment of people who are already ill.

To what extent do you agree or disagree?

2. Question: The number of people who are at risk of serious health problems due to being overweight is increasing.

What is the reason for the growth of overweight people in society?

How can this problem be solved?

3. Question: More and more people are suffering from health problems caused by a modern lifestyle which cannot be treated with modern medicines. Some people think that a return to traditional medicine should be encouraged.

4. Question: Human activities have negative effects on plant and animal species. Some people think it is too late to do anything about this problem. Others believe that effective measures can be taken to improve this situation.

Discuss both views and give your opinion.

5. Question: It is often said that governments spend too much money to protect wildlife, while there are other problems that are more important.

Do you agree or disagree?

6. Question: The best way to solve the world's environmental problems is to increase the cost of fuel for cars and other vehicles.

To what extent do you agree or disagree?

TOPIC 5: BUSINESS

1. Question: Some people think that big companies should provide sports and social facilities for the local community. To what extent do you agree or disagree?

4. Question: The availability of entertainment such as video games on handheld devices is harmful to individuals and to the society they live in.

To what extent do you agree and disagree?

5. Question: Some think that all entertainment TV programmes should educate people about the importance of social issues.

To what extent do you agree or disagree?

6. Question: Films were produced by big companies in the past, but today people are able to make a film.

Is this a negative or positive development?

TOPIC 7: SPORTS

1. Question: Today, TV channels show more men's sports than women's sports.

Why is this the case? Should TV channels give equal time to women's sports and men's sports?

To what extent do you agree or disagree?

5. Question: Some people believe that success in sports depends on physical ability. But some people believe there are many factors that contribute to success at sports.

Discuss both views and give your opinion.

6. Question: Some countries achieve international success by building specialized facilities to train top athletes instead of providing sports facilities that everyone can use.

Is it a positive or negative development?

TOPIC 8: LANGUAGE

1. Question: A few languages are increasingly spoken in different countries, while the use of others is rapidly declining.

Is it a positive or negative development?

2. Question: The development of tourism contributed to English becoming the most prominent language in the world. Some people think this will lead to English becoming the only language to be spoken legally.

What are the advantages and disadvantages of learning one language in the world?

3. Question: As computers translate quickly and accurately, learning foreign languages is a waste of time.

To what extent do you agree?

TOPIC 9: TECHNOLOGY

1. Question: Scientists believe that computers will become more intelligent than human beings. Some people find it is positive while others think it is a negative development. Discuss both views and give your own opinion.

2. Question: Some people believe that technology causes more problems for modern society than it solves.

To what extent do you agree or disagree?

3. Question: More and more people no longer read newspapers or watch TV programs to get news. They get news about the world through the Internet.

Is this a positive or negative development?

TOPIC 10: SOCIAL ISSUES

1. Question: In many countries, imprisonment is the most common solution to crimes. However, some people believe that better education will be a more effective solution.

To what extent do you agree or disagree?

2. Question: Nowadays, there is a trend that media reports focus on problems and emergencies rather than positive development. Some people think it is harmful to individuals and to society.

To what extent do you agree or disagree?

3. Question: In many nations, people in huge cities either live alone or in small family units, instead of in large, extended family groups.

Is this a positive or negative trend?

4. Question: The use of mobile phones is as antisocial as smoking. Smoking is banned in certain places so mobile phones should be banned like smoking.

5. Question: Most people have forgotten the meaning behind traditional and religious festivals; during festival periods, people nowadays only want to enjoy themselves.

TOPIC 11: DIFFICULT QUESTIONS

Discuss both views and give your opinion.


4. Question: In recent years, there has been growing interest in the relationship between equality and personal achievement. Some people believe that individuals can achieve more in egalitarian societies. Others believe that high levels of personal achievement are possible only if individuals are free to succeed or fail according to their individual merits.
